March 2026

This is not a letter 'from the vicarage' and until the vicarage is once again occupied by our priest, your monthly letter will be from different people.

Whilst the search for a new minister doesn't officially start until the Vacancy Meeting on 12th March with Bishop Richard and Archdeacon Dave, the churchwardens have been working hard arranging the farewell party for Nigel, contacting ministers to take our services at both the Church and Parish Centre, reviewing and retyping obvious changes to the Parish profile, bringing the Church Near You up to date, and making sure nothing slips through the cracks.

Everyone is welcome at the Vacancy Meeting which starts at 7:30 pm in the Parish Centre. Those present will be asked to provide their ideas, thoughts, and opinions on our strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, challenges, and our vision. These will be used to update the Parish profile. Also to be discussed will be the kind of minister we will be looking for. This meeting is where you can have your input in the process. Keech Hospice will also be asked for their input.

From this point on two elected representatives will handle the interests of the Parish.

An advertisement will be posted on the Diocese website, Pathways (Church of England) and the Church Times. There is already notice on the Diocese website that a vacancy is coming up for a priest and chaplain in Streatley. After the closing date for applications, a shortlisting meeting happens then interviews take place. Both these meetings are attended by the Archdeacon, Bishop, Area/Rural Dean, and the Parish Reps.

A tentative timetable has been suggested by the Archdeacon's office which is fairly tight but we will all work quickly to meet the deadlines and have a new minister in place as early as possible.

Thank you to those that have taken on additional responsibility during this time. In the absence of the Vicar, the Churchwardens assume legal responsibility for the Parish so your support is hugely appreciated.

In the meanwhile, pray God sends us the right person quickly.





March 17th is celebrated as St Patrick's Day. Two of our popular hymns have an Irish connection and both are sung to the tune "**Slane**".

Slane is a picturesque village in Ireland where St Patrick lit the first Paschal fire, which symbolised "light over darkness" - an Easter tradition. St Patrick made a vital contribution to the spread of Christianity over Paganism.

Be Thou my vision (tune: Slane)

The original version was written in the eighth century. The wise saying of Solomon "Where there is no vision, people perish" is the core of this hymn. (Proverbs 29v.18.)

Lord of all hopefulness


is also sung to the tune Slane. The words were by the English writer Jan Struther and describe an ordinary day of trusting God to be with us throughout the day.

CHURCHWARDENS' NEWS

We have finally resolved the electrical problem at church by replacing the fuse box. The church is now lovely and warm.

The allotment lease agreements have been distributed to all tenants with a mixture of reactions, a few questions of clarification, especially around what has historically been allowed. Some have been returned signed. Julia has prepared a response to all queries which will be distributed shortly.

Quotes have been received for the hedge trimming at the church and the allotments with the work being timed to avoid any disruption to nesting birds.


The church alarm has been serviced, and everything is in good working order.

Three contractors have shown their interest in quoting for the Quinquennial Inspection repairs and have attended the church to view the necessary work, but so far no quotes have been received. However, a Letter of Authorisation from the Diocese has been received.

We have been busy organising a farewell party for Nigel and preparing for interregnum. There is a feeling of optimism in the Archdeacon's office that we will be able to fill the position quite quickly. Let us all pray this is the case. Of course, this means we have a lot to do in a very short time. In the meantime, retired ministers have been contacted to help out.

Our vacancy meeting is on 12th March at the Parish Centre at 7:30 pm. Refreshments will be served commencing at 7 pm. This meeting is for everyone in the Parish who is interested and will be facilitated by the Bishop and Archdeacon. We will be exploring the skills and attributes we are looking for in our new Vicar, collecting thoughts and views of all the participants in order to create the role profile to form part of the recruitment process.

There is now a folder at the Parish Centre and in Church containing job descriptions to help volunteers understand the roles and responsibilities of each position. This is an ongoing project together with our Safeguarding Officer, Carol Moody.

February Meeting 2025

What a wonderful fun afternoon on a really miserable day outside, lovely to hear the hall full of laughter as Linda Stephenson introduced us to her puppets.

Puppetry is the manipulation of animals and was started 4000 years ago. In the 5th Century BC there are written records of Egyptians using them for plays, story telling and religious events - generally for entertainment.

We were first introduced to Jed a Focart from Burma who was 80 years old. He was on strings and sadly had lost an ear but the workmanship that had gone into him was quite amazing.

In the Middle Ages there were hand puppets and string puppets also known as Marionettes. The word Marionettes came from the bible - Marion and the church encouraged them until comedy was introduced so they were banned.



Comedy de la - was introduced in the time of Charles II when Italian puppet troupes came over. They introduced Punchinello which eventually became Mr Punch and wife Joan (later to become Judy) whom many recalled watching on the beach on their holidays. Strings were hard to use so they became hand puppets. Originally it was slap stick with Mr Punch hitting people.

We then went on to recall the first TV puppets - which included Mr Turnip, Hank - the

cowboy, Pinky & Perky, Sooty, Bill & Ben, Andy Pandy, the Muppets - Miss Piggy and Kermit who were rod puppets. Whilst in Prague Linda had watched 2 operas performed by string puppets.

Linda then showed us Virgil Tracey, a string puppet. We saw sock puppets and push puppets and Pelham puppets. Whilst in the army Bob Pelham introduced these - firstly Wonky Donkey. The only problem with these is the tangles in the strings. Hand/glove puppets then took over. We met a string puppet Raccoon who looked so real. Linda does a local radio show and uses Jasper Rabbit and his sister Sylvia to whom we were introduced. Then out came a frog from Madrid - he looked armless enough and Linda was looking for a volunteer to kiss him for luck - there being no volunteers I volunteered and shock horror as I bent forward out came a long red tongue - it was quite a shock but amused us all.

We then meet Billy the Puffin, Canasta the camel, Philip the unicorn who is the National animal of Scotland (who knew that?). Then a very large dodo from Mauritius. Some ladies had brought along their own soft toys and Linda showed how easy it was to use them as puppets. The art is to keep them moving. The ladies then had the chance to come and handle the puppets. Linda had just brought along a few of her puppets which seemed quite a number but there were lots left at home. Thanks, Linda, for a very interesting and amusing afternoon.

Judy also had to announce the sad passing of Jean Flower - a long time member and Committee member who did an awful lot behind the scenes to ensure the smooth running of this Guild. She hosted all our Committee meetings and was so dependable. We will really miss her lovely welcoming smile and all the help she gave and the friendships she made. Thank you, Jean, for everything you did. RIP
