From Ron

Dear All,

Ron here. Sixty years ago, my first love was a girl called Beryl. She was beautiful, with a Liverpool accent which was the height of fashion in 1966, and a Yorkshire Terrier. It was very small, like an escaped moustache, brown and hairy like a thousand-year-old Mars bar. Beryl took it for short walks because its legs were only two inches long, so it was tired out by the time it got to her front gate. She loved it, despite the fact that its bark was so high pitched only bats could hear it.

It was a Saturday morning when I called round. The animal was sitting on a shiny kitchen chair, and when it saw me it barked. And every time it barked, it recoiled backwards like a tiny cannon going off, until it fell off the chair. Laugh? I did. And Beryl was furious.

“How can you say you love me,” she said, “if you laugh at my dog?” And she went on about it at some length, then never spoke to me again and married Jim Hebden.

In a lot of our modern worship songs, we say how much we love Jesus, but what does that mean? I used to tell Beryl I loved her, but then I disrespected her little dog, and she took that to mean I didn't really love her. And loving Jesus isn't about what we say, or what we sing, but by what we do.



Jesus said if we love him, we will love his people. We show our love for Jesus by showing love to his people - that is, everybody. Whatever we do for the least of his little ones, we do for him. And whatever we neglect to do for them, he takes it that we've neglected to do for him.

In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus describes how we will be judged, not by how we have behaved towards him, but by how we have treated the ones he loves. The poor, the needy, the hungry and homeless, the prisoners. It's so easy to pass by people in need and do nothing. So easy to drop the charity appeals straight into the bin. So easy to look after the ones we like and approve of, and not the ones who could just do with a friendly word, an assurance that somebody cares.

Beryl was right.

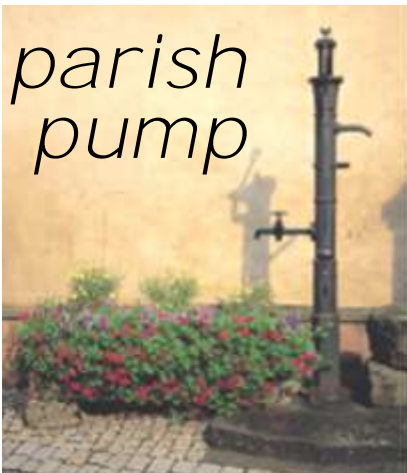

Subscription Reminder

Just a reminder that your subscription for the 2026 Beacon is now due and if you have not already paid, please return your subscription in the brown envelopes provided - either to your distributor, your PCC Treasurer or Churchwarden or to the Parish Office at 6 The Close, North Cadbury.

Unfortunately, increased costs and the reduced circulation (as the magazine is only delivered to Galhampton, North Cadbury, South Cadbury and Yarlinton), does mean that the price of The Beacon has increased to £1 with an annual subscription of £10 for all 11 issues. Many thanks to all those who have paid their subscriptions already.

Advertising Rates

Also as a result of the increased costs of production, a decision has been taken to increase the price of advertising in The Beacon. This will now cost £4 for an eighth of a page; £8 for a quarter page; and £16 for a half page. If taken out for a year (11 issues), adverts will cost £40 for an eighth of a page; £80 for a quarter page; and £160 for a half page. The new rates will apply to

existing adverts when renewed.

Early spring has brought a welcome sense of renewal to school life, even against the backdrop of the extraordinary rain that has marked these first months of the year. As a school community, we pause to hold in

our thoughts those families and farmers whose land and homes have been affected by flooding. With the children, we have spoken gently about compassion and solidarity, and how we are called to notice the struggles of others and respond with kindness.

In school, there has still been a real sense of energy and purpose moving through our corridors, with a quiet determination in our

children to grow, to serve and to aim high.

A particular highlight has been the development of our student leadership programme. It has been a joy to watch pupils step forward to champion causes close to their hearts. Some have chosen to lead our ongoing environmental work and carefully consider how we reduce waste and care for the world entrusted to us. Others have volunteered to support learning in subjects they love, while sharing their enthusiasm with younger pupils and helping to build a culture where passion is celebrated. There is something deeply encouraging in seeing children recognise that their voices matter, and that leadership is, at its heart, an act of service.

We were also privileged to welcome a world class athlete into school this month. His message of resilience and perseverance resonated powerfully with the children. He spoke honestly about setbacks, effort and the courage required to continue when success feels distant. His visit beautifully reinforced our value of Ambition this term,

which we understand not as comparison but as a faithful commitment to becoming the best version of ourselves. The children left inspired and buzzing with questions and reflections about what they might achieve through dedication and belief.

Alongside this, we continued our important partnership work with the NSPCC, supporting pupils to understand how they can stay safe, particularly in the online world. These conversations are never taken lightly. We are proud of how thoughtfully our children engage with them, while showing maturity and care for one another. It is a reminder that education is not only about knowledge but also about equipping young people with wisdom and discernment for the lives they are growing into.

Sport has also given us much to celebrate. Our cross-country teams have represented the school with determination and grace. Many of our runners achieved top five finishes in their divisions, while one pupil secured first place, which is an achievement earned through months of quiet commitment and practice. Beyond the medals, what stands out most is the encouragement they showed one another as they cheered teammates across the finish line and embodied true sportsmanship.

As we look back on the month, we do so with gratitude. Gratitude for children who strive to be the best they can be, for staff who guide them with care and for a community that continually supports our shared work. There is much to be thankful for, and much to look forward to as we continue the journey together

From the Bishop

The Church of England's theme for Lent 2026 is 'Draw Near: Life-giving habits for Lent'. It's a very different way of thinking about the season. Often, we identify Lent as a time for prayer and fasting when we 'give things up'. More recently many have decided to adopt an opposite approach – of 'taking something up for Lent'. 'Draw near' has a much wider remit. Each week, it invites us to explore a different aspect of Christian discipleship – worshipping together, praying, exploring the Bible, sharing communion, offering service and sharing the good news with others.

The 'Draw Near' approach fits well with how Lent began. During the Church's earliest days, those wishing to become Christians were known as 'catechumens', people who were learning to live as disciples of Jesus. Preparation was intensive. It took place particularly in the 40 days before new Christians were baptised on the Saturday night before Easter Sunday. Our season of Lent comes from this ancient practice.

When the Church began, it didn't have the trappings we're used to seeing around us such as buildings, hymn books, pews, or paid ministers. Church wasn't an institution. It was known as 'the Way'. Christians met in each other's homes and sought to

work out how to follow Jesus in their every day lives. This wasn't so much about head knowledge, believing a particular set of doctrines. It was about the habits and practices that Christians constantly cultivated to help them draw nearer to God who is with us, in us, around us and beside us every moment of every day. 'Draw Near' comes out of this heritage. It's an invitation to make Lent a journey that brings us closer to God.

I invite you to make use of 'Draw Near' this Lent. It includes materials for adults, for families and for children, resources for schools and encouragement for churches. More information can be found at www.cofeio/DrawNear. As we approach Lent, let's draw near and join each other on the journey to God that is the Way.

NORTH CADBURY & YARLINGTON PARISH COUNCIL (PC)

Latest news and topics discussed at the PC meeting held in Jan 2026.

Budget & Precept figures for 2026/2027: The PC resolved to increase the precept from £27,000 to £30,000, this equates to an annual increase of approx. 10.6% or £5.39 per household (from £50.86 to £56.25), based on a Band D property, due to the changes in the tax base rate set by Somerset Council (SC). The precept calculation and supporting notes can be found as attachments 1 and 2 to the minutes on the parish website.

Provision of Community Public Access Defibrillators (cPADs):

A resident was present to discuss the need/provision/locations of additional CPADs in the parish, following a recent emergency at an event in North Cadbury, at which the defibrillator helped save a life. The following points were discussed: training on how to use cPADs and knowledge of First Responders, time taken to access cPADs/locations and funding for additional cPADs.

Cllr J Rundle was pleased to inform the PC that a resident at Brookhampton Corner, North Cadbury had volunteered to 'host' a cPAD. Councillors agreed unanimously to approve the purchase of an additional cPAD for installation at Brookhampton Corner.

Following advice from Cllr R Rundle on the warranty status of the other cPADs in the parishes, the Clerk agreed to contact the Village Hall Committees to let them know where they could purchase replacement parts/cPADs at a competitive price if necessary and propose the need for training on the use of cPADs.

Reports from Somerset Council (SC):

Councillor Henry Hobhouse reported as follows:

Budget – the Government had increased the SC grant from £290m to £293m. SC has had to adjust their budget setting timetable due to delays in the Government's funding announcement. The delay would significantly impact its budget process with limited available time if the announcement was not known until the end of February 2026.

Flood Mitigation Measures – Yarlington systems recently implemented were working well, reducing any detrimental effect at the other end of the river Cam. Discussion ensued on recent flood events in the area, thankfully no properties in the combined parishes had been affected.

Highways – potholes finally filled in on the exit slip roads from the A303 at the North/South Cadbury exits.

Report from The Newt and Emily Estate:

Zoe Young, Community Liaison Officer, reported as follows:

Frequent checks on drainage and the natural flood measures across the estate during this heavy rainfall. We've been pleased with the attenuation ponds especially the trout ponds and their impact in reducing flooding in Yarlinton. The overflowing drain outside the Farmyard Hotel is being addressed.

In development news, Yarlinton Lodge is now entering its testing phase. The new farm continues to progress well; it will be in partial use from the autumn with all construction finished by spring 2027.

Notice of approval of a permitted development of an agricultural track linking the Farmyard Hotel to the existing farm tracks and to the trout pond. Work will begin in the next couple of weeks. (Hard copy of route circulated at meeting.)

Planning: Brookhampton Development: Cllr R Rundle reported that Origin 3 had finally received feedback from SC on its pre-application just before Christmas. SC had 'pushed back' on the number of units proposed and challenged some aspects of its design. Origin were in discussion with SC re scheme design and the scheme frontage onto the highway. Cllr Rundle hoped to have more information in the next four to six weeks.

Cam Community River Project (CCRP): Cllr Whitehead reported that after the recent heavy rain sewage was again bubbling out of manholes in Brookhampton. The Clerk agreed to keep the pressure on Wessex Water by sending an email attaching a video of the sewage cover with an additional video of the sewage cover in Chapel Lane where excess water is running down Chapel Lane, bypassing the drains and flowing down to Brookhampton. The Clerk agreed to ask WW if they have any further information/timing on works they plan to carry out.

As a result of discussions with Somerset RoW department they are proposing to replace the concrete footbridge downstream from Brookhampton with a new wooden bridge. The existing bridge is often below water and also acts as a dam impeding the flow of the River Cam.

Gully and drain clearance to be discussed as an agenda item for the next meeting.

INTERVIEW - Safeguarding the integrity of creation



Revd Lindsay Smith from St Peter's Church, Portishead shares how the church community will be using the Plenty Lent course to deepen their understanding of creation care and learn to live out the fifth Mark of Mission: "to strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth", in all that they do.

What did you decide to focus on in the environment during Lent?

We chose the Plenty Lent course because it helps us embed this calling to care for creation in all that we do. It will challenge us — and that can only be a good thing, as it raises awareness and encourages deeper reflection.

What will you be doing?

We will be thinking about creation care in all that we do, and considering how, as a church and as individuals, we can advocate for a fair and green economy. It will also encourage us that we can make a difference to the world we live in.

How does the period of Lent help you do this?

It offers us an opportunity to deepen our relationship with God, study the

Bible, and reflect on our own journey. Doing the Plenty course will affirm the parish's eco actions with biblical teaching and help us gain a deeper understanding of why we all need to care for God's creation.

How will the Lent course help you focus on the environment?

We will set time aside during Lent to take a deeper look at ourselves and the way we live, reflecting on all the big ethical questions. The course will help us explore these questions through a green lens.

How will people be joining in?

We're offering a mix of in person meetings and online sessions, and our Home Groups will follow the course too. Prayer will remain at the heart of everything we do. We trust that the Holy Spirit will deepen the bonds we share, drawing us closer to one another and to the places God is calling us.

Do you hope this will last beyond Lent?

Our hope is that this becomes part of who we are, not just something we do for forty days.

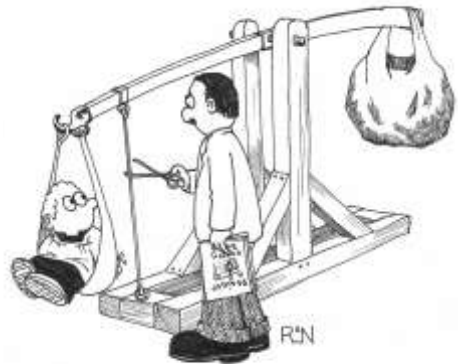
