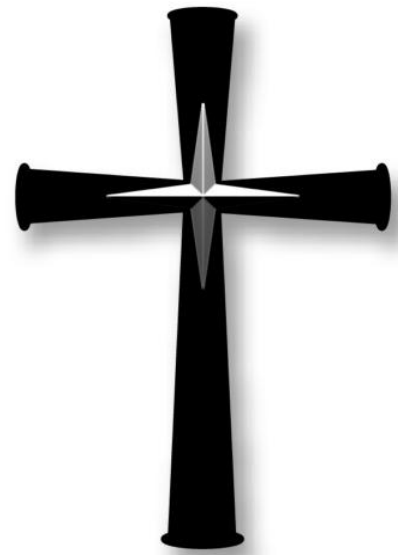

Dear All

May 2026

Have you recovered from all the excitement of Easter, with the services coming thick and fast - Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Sunday - it can be easy to become internally focussed both as a church and individually (more later). Of course, the Easter season continues well beyond Easter Sunday. We now move towards Ascension Day on 14th May and Pentecost on 24th May. Within the 28 days following on from Easter Sunday, the focus remains on the themes of growth and transition but also provides an opportunity to move back into active mission for the church.

At the Ascension, Jesus commissions his disciples with the promise of the Holy Spirit. In recognition of this, the 10 days between Ascension and Pentecost will see 'The Kingdom Come' initiative, which focusses on praying for others to come to faith. This initiative was founded in 2016 by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York. In 2025 the Kingdom Come initiative involved over a million Christians across 85 denominations in nearly 90% of the world's countries. The idea is that each of us prays for 5 friends or family members for 5 minutes each day, that they will find God and choose to follow Him. Why not take part in 'The Kingdom Come' this year?



In May, nature will continue bringing new life, with a need for nurturing and tending new shoots; the same is true of faith where growth and community now come to the fore. This is a time to nurture opportunities to bring new people into church, inviting the community in. Do you have an idea for how we may do this? Please share any ideas with the churchwardens. How can we support you in trying something new to attract people into our church buildings? Or maybe it is more about building closer links with other local churches?

The fete, which is fast approaching at the beginning of June, is an ideal opportunity to welcome the wider community in. Please do all you can to support the summer fete on 6th June this year. This could include putting up gazebos in the morning, providing something to sell or raffle, running one of the many stalls or attending the lovely lunch and afternoon tea in the village hall. The opportunities are many and varied but the most important thing is the warm welcome that we give to everyone who joins us on the day, no matter the weather 😊

Let's grow our church together, in faith.

Hymn of the month

How Great Thou Art

Oh Lord my God, when I in awesome wonder consider all the works
Thy hands have made....

The origins of this well-loved hymn lie in the majestic hills and valleys of the beautiful Swedish countryside. It was there in 1885, that a Lutheran minister Rev'd Carl Boberg was caught in a dramatic thunderstorm.

There were inspiring moments of flashing violence, torrential rain, followed by brilliant sunshine. Soon afterwards he was overcome by the calm, sweet bird song coming from the nearby trees. He was moved to write this stirring 3 verse poem.

It was later set to a Swedish folk melody. As it grew in popularity, it was translated into German, Russian and English. After the Second World War a fourth verse was added.

This hymn has become one of our nation's favourites.
