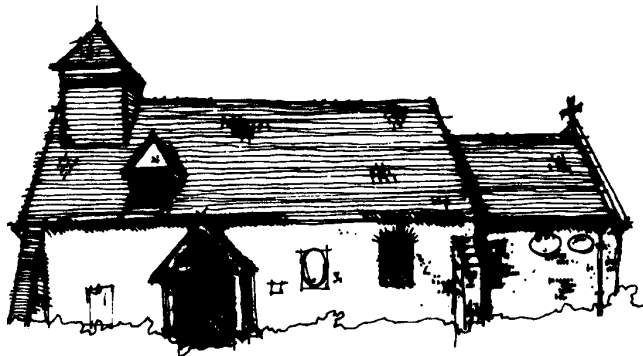

## From our Associate Priest

Dear Friends,

Spring is here! I love this time of year: the new brightness of the sunshine, the warming air alongside the new life in both our gardens and the fields perfectly matches the hope of this Easter time as we continue to celebrate!

It seems to me that Easter is the opposite of the Christmas season... Christmas is increasingly all about the build-up, and then, for many is all finished and packed up by New Year! But when it comes to Easter, although we start with our preparations during Lent, building to the emotional roller coaster of Palm Sunday through the increasingly tragic events of Holy Week, our celebrations actually only start on Easter Sunday! And then the celebrations continue for fifty days, the fifty days from Easter to Pentecost.

But Easter Sunday, Resurrection Day, was really only the very beginning of the new life for those early believers; for fifty days the disciples remained frightened and behind closed doors, always amazed when Jesus came amongst them, but still lacking the courage to open the doors, go out and tell others. However, forty days after Easter Jesus was taken from them into his Father's presence – the Ascension – and still frightened they hid, until *finally* ten days later, the arrival of the transforming Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Pentecost may bring the Easter season to a close, yet it was really only the beginning of the rest of the lives of those first believers. At Pentecost the Holy Spirit arrived in a new way, bringing power, courage and confidence. The newly empowered followers of The Way moved from the comfort of the upper room onto the streets to tell people about Jesus, about forgiveness, about the new life and about God's love.

Pentecost may bring the Easter season to a close, yet it is really just the beginning of the rest of our lives too – emboldened by the power of the Holy Spirit we too can move out, move out of our comfort zone to live the New Life and maybe, with new courage and confidence, tell others about the amazingly Good News of Jesus...

Traditionally the ten days from Ascension to Pentecost have been a special time to pray for friends and family to come to know that Jesus' resurrection is true and that, because of this, forgiveness and new life are possible. Maybe we could choose five friends to pray for each of these ten days - to pray that they too might know Jesus' new life and the power of the Holy Spirit!

Halleluiah! Christ is Risen!  
He is risen indeed! Halleluiah!

## Mental Health Awareness Week

**11-17 May 2026**

This year's Mental Health Awareness Week takes place 11 -17 May. This year's theme is 'Action', because, while awareness is vital, real change comes when we take action too.



At all levels, the Church can be 'a voice for the voiceless', helping to reduce the stigma often associated with peoples' mental health.

### **Dealing with loneliness and isolation: five top tips from the National Church website .....**

Find simple ways to deal with loneliness and isolation.

- 1. Pray. Light a candle, if safe, and pray for hope, faith and strength to keep loving and caring for each other during this time of struggle.**
- 2. Talk about how you feel.** This may be difficult if you are self-isolating, but do use the telephone, internet, and social media. If you need to contact a counsellor this can be arranged by your GP, or via local agencies, or privately. The Samaritans are there 24 hours a day, every day, and it's free to call them on 116 123.
- 3. Focus on the things that you can change, not on the things you can't.**
- 4. Look after yourself - physically, emotionally, spiritually.** Plan in things that you enjoy at regular intervals during the day – a TV programme, a phone call, a book, a favourite dish, a game.
- 5. Look after others. Even if only in small ways, but do what you can:** a smile, a kind word, writing a letter or an email.

# Inaugural Farley Chamberlayne Green Lane Challenge Cup

We would welcome anyone including those with disabilities, carers, friends. We will serve Coffee, Tea and Biscuits at the end and our wish is that you enjoy the time together.

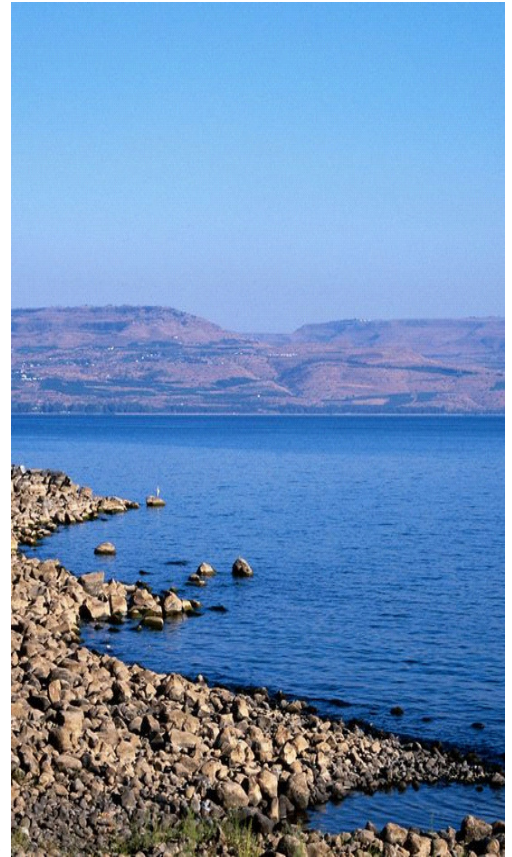

## WHO IS IN YOUR BOAT WITH YOU?

A few years ago I was fortunate enough to visit the Holy Land which had a lasting impression on me: when I returned, it was as though my Bible was in colour.

During my trip we stayed for a few nights by the Sea of Galilee. It's also known as Lake Kinneret. Walking close to the edge by the water there was an awesome feeling that Jesus had walked, taught and healed people in this vicinity. It is very peaceful there, the sun light catching the little peaks on the waves as the water ebbs and flows gently. The trees were fluttering their leaves in the breeze and in the distance, you could see that the lake is surrounded by mountains. The mountains are known as the Galilee Mountains to the west and the Golan Heights to the east.

As I watched the sky turn slate grey and felt the chill in the air, I was reminded of the moment when the disciples left Jesus by boat after he fed

the five thousand. Jesus must have been exhausted after healing the sick and teaching such a large crowd, yet instead of seeking a quiet place to rest, his priority was to ascend the mountain and pray to his Father alone. His actions inspire us to reflect on whether we too turn first to prayer.

Previously, when Jesus heard that his cousin John the Baptist had been beheaded, he withdrew in a boat to a deserted place by himself (Matthew 14 v.13 *NRSV - New Revised Standard Version*). This is such a human reaction, needing time to digest the news and to pray. I wonder if we have a similar reaction when we receive sad news? What would our emotional response be? I think we might need time on our own, and it wouldn't matter if our prayers were just tears.

Prayers seem to come at all different times and places, but Jesus reminds us also that solitary prayer is important. 'When you go to pray, go into your room and close the door and pray to our Father who is unseen. Then your Father who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.' (Matthew 6 v.6 *NIV - New International Version*)

Whilst Jesus was praying on the mountain after feeding the crowd, he became aware that a storm was brewing. It was about 4am in the morning and he noticed that the disciples' boat was way out in the middle of the sea. The wind was blowing a hooley and the sky and the sea were black as ink, the crashing waves making it impossible as they were beating up wind, which was against the boat. The waves were nearly engulfing them; they were so frightened. Then they were trying to look across the water: with the spray drenching their faces they thought they had seen a ghost walking towards them on the water; your mind can play tricks on you when you are exhausted and have not slept. They had been separated from Jesus physically and perhaps mentally, they were filled with dread and fear.

Would we be 'praying our socks off' at this point? When we are in the midst of fear do we forget to say, 'Please help me Jesus'?

Then Jesus was walking towards them and spoke: 'Take heart, it is I, do not be afraid,' (*in Exodus 3 v.4 the Divine Name 'I am who I am' which God said to Moses*). What a wonderful reassurance from Jesus!

Peter answered him, 'Lord if this is you, command me to come to you on the water,' and in the raging storm Jesus said 'Come'.

This simple word 'Come' is an invitation for us all in our lives.

Peter tended to act first without thinking, perhaps without praying. He steps out of the boat letting his hand let go of the gunnel; we can imagine his body being battered as he starts to climb out being tossed around with the cold

spray on his face. Perhaps he feels a little elated that he is out of the boat, but when he notices what's going on around him, the harsh wind and the spray of the sea on him, he becomes frightened and begins to sink. Have we ever stepped out into a difficult situation, not thinking straight, not prepared, not prayed, that sinking feeling? Perhaps we should stop and reflect. Jesus has asked us to come to Him. He wants to help us; he is loving and compassionate. He says 'Come.'

Peter cried out 'Lord save me.' Jesus reached out his hand and took hold of him, 'You of little faith, why did you doubt?' What counts is not courage or strength here but Jesus' saving presence.

Once Jesus and Peter were back in the boat the wind ceased. This picture of Jesus getting back into the boat has an imagery that he will be with us in our Boat, in our storms of life, if we reach out to Him in prayer. We only need cry out 'Jesus save me', when the waves of fear are slamming against us. Once he steps into our situation the anxiety ebbs and he 'Comes.'

In this passage and many times in the New Testament, Jesus' relationship and love of his Father was unequivocal and led him on many occasions to pray.

Do we pray, talk to Jesus? Most of us have loving relationships with family members and close friends and enjoy spending time with them. We share our joys and sorrow, we speak to them often and share things that may be difficult or that we are struggling with. When you love someone, you want to be close to them and Jesus simply wants us to have a relationship with Him. As he says in this passage 'Come' and the amazing thing is He then offers us his hand. He wants to save us, help and guide us. 'Come.'

When we see or hear a wonderful moment in nature, a deer in the distance like a statue, beautiful flowers with bees buzzing busily taking nectar, a newborn baby, or we hear beautiful music which emotionally resonates with us, something stirs in us. Our eyes are opened, and we have an overwhelming sense of gratitude. Savour these experiences and thank God.

Prayer can be as simple as saying 'Save me Jesus' or 'Thank you Jesus.' He has an overwhelming love for us and wants us to 'Come' to Him.

So, who will be in your boat with you?

Despite the challenges Fridah faces, she maintains her unwavering faith: **'It's hard, but in God I trust - for the strength to keep going every day.'**
