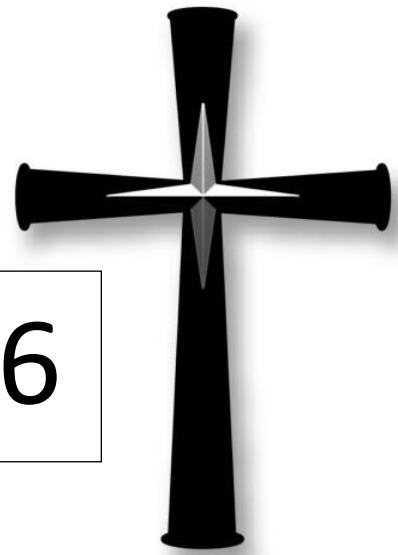

Dear All

July/August 2026

As Bishop Richard recently visited the Church and the Parish Centre, I thought I would share his recent opening letter from the Bishop's Bulletin. Happy reading. Julia.

One of the riches of being an Anglican is that we are part of an international family, the Anglican Communion. It is a global fellowship of 42 autonomous Member Churches (Provinces) and five Extra-Provincial areas, which unites millions of people across 165 countries. This international communion is most visible when the Bishops gather in Canterbury as they did in 2022, for the Lambeth Conference. In principle, the Anglican Communion is a rare sign of connectedness across our divided world.

Now, I suspect the Communion does not rank that highly for most of us on our map of Anglican identity. Contact with Anglicans overseas is often limited, and when we do hear about the Communion it is usually in the context of uncertainty about its future. Some members of the Global Fellowship of Confessing Anglicans (GAFCON), in particular Nigeria, Uganda and Rwanda, have ceased participating in Communion meetings. Others, particularly within the Global South Fellowship of Anglican Churches (GSFA), are calling for reform, especially concerning the nature of ecclesial communion and the role of the Archbishop of Canterbury. At the end of this month, the Anglican Consultative Council meets in Belfast to explore these questions. Please hold the Communion in your prayers.

Despite these issues (far more than can be adequately explored here), we rejoice in the partners we share. We have recently welcomed into our diocese the Revd Suchitra Behera, from the Church of Bangladesh, who is spending a year with us as an associate priest in the Radlett Team. Suchitra will also be available to speak across the Diocese, helping us learn from the experience of a minority Anglican church in Asia. We will hear more at our June Diocesan Synod.

At the St Alban's Day Pilgrimage we will be joined by Bishop Charles Davidson from our link Diocese of Guyana. This is down to our long-standing link with four Dioceses in the Caribbean.

The Bishop of Linköping, Bishop Marika Markovits, has committed to being at the installation of Bishop Andrew later this year, an expression of our developing link that recently saw +Jane and others attending their Diocesan Synodal meeting in Sweden. Linköping is a Porvoo church in communion with the Anglican Communion.

*And there are many others, especially local parish links. **As we pray for our Communion, let us rejoice in the links we have and consider how we can further our oneness in Christ.***

On behalf of Jane and all my senior colleagues, thank you once again for your witness as together we build Christ's church that is both local and for all the world.

Hymn of the month

July

**Lord for the years your love has kept and guided,
Urged and inspired us, cheered us on our way.**

This hymn was written by the late Bishop Timothy Dudley-Smith. It is one of over 400 that he wrote, all having a deep meaning. Another example - "Tell out my soul the greatness of the Lord."

He said "Hymns are extremely important - many people learn more theology from hymns than from anywhere else. They stay in the memory!" The inspiration for his writing comes from the work of Charles Wesley.

Lord for the years has a Biblical quality.

There is a sense of the God of the Old Testament walking alongside His people through the ages. There is the sense of the Holy Spirit still speaking to our hearts. There is a sense of Jesus, the Man of sorrows, disowned and doubted - but now reigns as King. And there is the sense of the world God loves and a sense of moving forward to the future God has for us.

Timothy Dudley-Smith never wastes words. This hymn is a spirit-filled inspiration, and he challenges us to make God "The Lord of our lives" and to "Live for Christ alone."

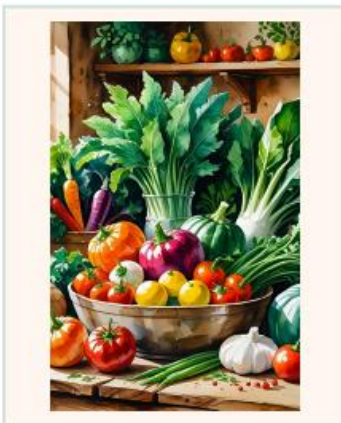

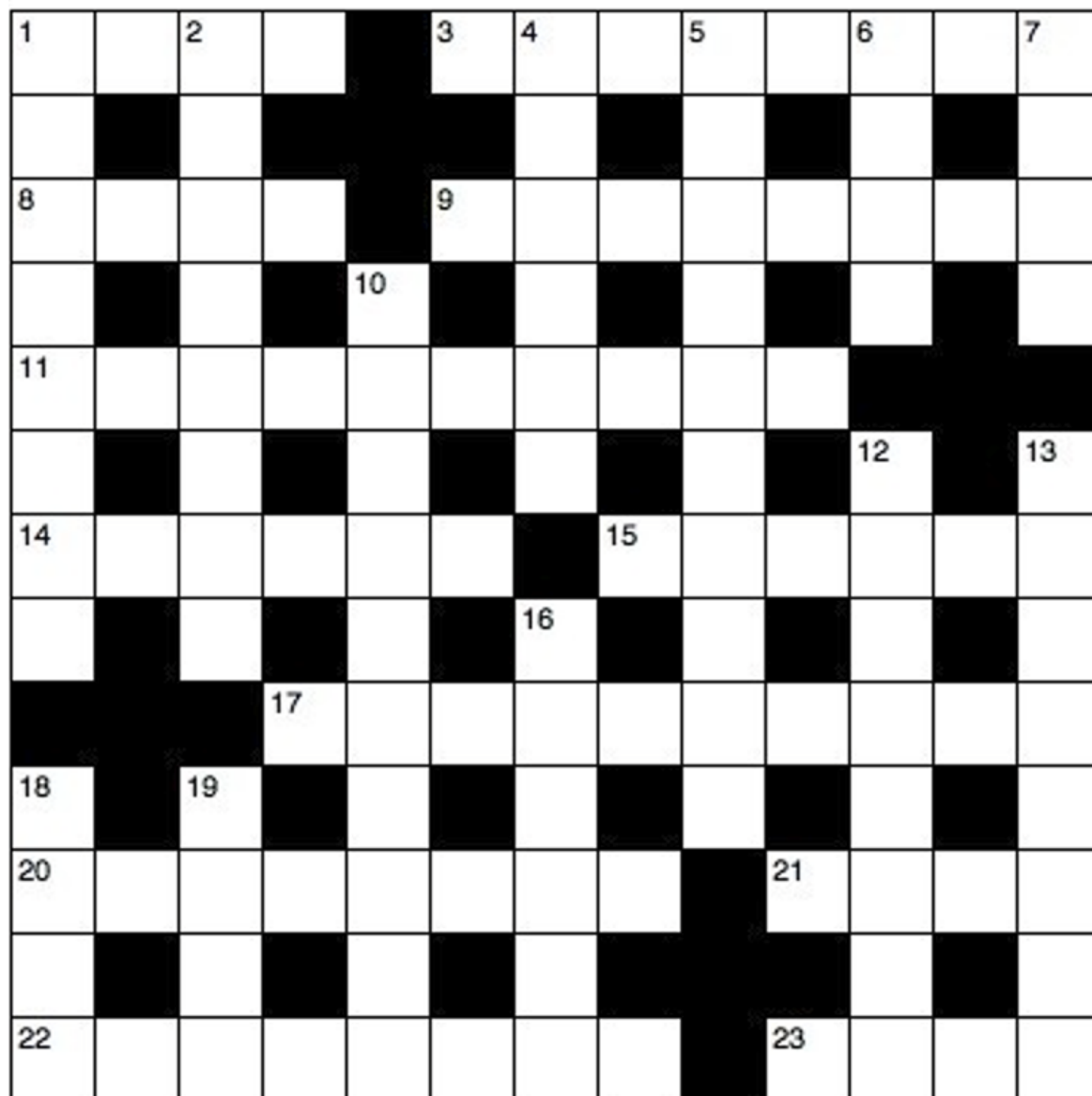

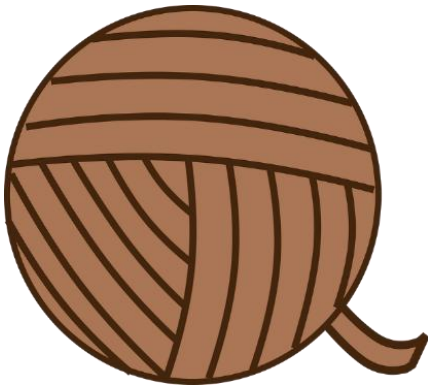

ST MARGARET'S LADIES' GUILD

June 2026

At our June meeting Mr Howard Chandler gave us an interesting insight, with many pictures, of Leagrave as far back as the eighteen hundreds, sourced from the book The History of Luton.

Howard is a Luton boy, having attended William Austin School, and worked at the Luton Library.

In 1224 Leagrave was a lightly wooded grove named after the river Lea and was bounded by Marsh Road and Roman Road.

1851 - 418 people lived in the area..

1856 - Only one third of people in Leagrave could read, as they were needed to work on the farms.

1874 - Eighteen children were under tuition.

1869 – The railway was built, splitting Leagrave in two

1906 - Street names were given.

1914 - Aeroplanes were being made at Electrolux. There was a brewery nearby, and a sports field behind the factory. Also the Methodist chapel was built (now St Lukes).

1921 – The War Memorial was unveiled by Lady Ludlow, a well-liked lady. Thirty-five men died in the 1914-18 war. In the same year Leagrave Library was built. There was a blacksmith until 2010.

1928 - Leagrave became part of Luton.

In the early 1900's Leagrave was known as Leagrave on Sea and many Luton families would spend a day or a few days there during the summer. There was a form of transport from Luton but many walked. We saw where they would stay. It was amazing to see so many people in the water enjoying themselves.

Another thing Howard showed us was a beautiful Manor House - which none of us recognised and it turned out to be what was Moorlands School off Leagrave High Street, now a school for Muslim children. It is a beautiful building but seen by so few.

We saw lots of pictures of the streets as they used to be and a large number of public houses - now there are none at all. I think that most people remembered The Three Horse Shoes public house where McDonalds now stands.

Howard brought back many memories for our ladies, and his talk was thoroughly enjoyed.

Motor neurone disease (MND) is a life-shortening neurological condition that affects the nerves controlling movement. It causes progressive muscle weakness, which can affect how a person walks, talks, eats, drinks and breathes.

Symptoms vary from person to person and usually get worse over time, but support, treatment and equipment can help people live as well as possible.

This page gives a basic overview of motor neurone disease (MND) with links to further information if you want to read more.

What is MND in simple terms?

Motor neurone disease damages the nerves (motor neurones) that send messages from the brain to the muscles. When these nerves stop working, the muscles gradually weaken.

This can affect movement and mobility, speech and communication, eating and drinking and breathing. Some people also experience changes in thinking and behaviour. These are usually mild but can be more noticeable for some. MND does not usually affect sight, hearing and touch. Although there is currently no cure, symptoms can be managed to help maintain the best possible quality of life.
