LETTER FROM THE RECTORY



I write sitting in JFK airport while awaiting our flight home. We came to New York for a wedding, and looking back over the last six days I realise that we have not just been on holiday, we have been on a pilgrimage.

A wedding – and June is a good month for weddings! – is a celebration of love: I knew that! And it was! But we found love throughout: in the kindness of flight attendants, the “good day” hospitality and welcoming smiles of hotel and restaurant staff, the warm embrace of old friends and the blossoming of new friendships.

This pilgrimage of love was amazingly encapsulated in the giant motto, by Hank Willis Thomas, high on the wall the foyer of the Brooklyn Museum: in giant neon blue lettering, the words “LOVERULES”. This iconic image is illuminated in a sequence emphasising the words differently – **LOVERULES**, **LOVERULES**, **LOVERULES**, **LOVERULES** – and communicates to all entering the Museum that love is, in the artist’s words, ‘not an action of receiving, but rather an action of giving.’ Amen.

Our annual Gift Day with Cream Teas will be taking place in the Village Hall on Saturday 27 June.

As many of you living in older properties will know, the task of maintaining a historic building such as our Parish Church can be a daunting one. We receive no government funding (unlike some European countries), so our relatively small congregation bears the whole financial responsibility for the life and work of the Parish Church. Recent Government tax changes also mean it is more difficult to recover the VAT on maintenance work.

Our Common Fund payment still needs to be paid to the diocese. Elsewhere in Country News you will read that our rector, Mike, will be retiring shortly. Church services will continue and we will still enjoy the support of ordained clergy (as well as the Lay team) to lead our services in church every week, and occasional offices such as baptisms, weddings & funerals.

Church members believe that God calls them to be generous in their giving to his work, and the congregation responds to that call. However, without help from others that task is beyond such a small group of people. That is why we are so grateful to local friends who join with us each year on Gift Day, bringing their financial gifts in support of the work of the parish.

The Cream Teas will be available from 2.30 – 4.30 in the Village Hall, and it would be wonderful to see you there!

On May 9th, Paul Oxley with father and son Craig and Ben Milverton came to do a gig in the village hall. Not only is Paul a very successful singer song-writer and guitarist but Craig is also a renowned jazz pianist and Ben is a guitarist of note.

Paul has spent many years in Finland where he had a very successful career with sold out gigs, number one records and TV appearances. He has now moved back to the UK after his band broke up and has started a new group which he brought to our village hall. Craig Milverton is one of Britain's finest Jazz Pianists and this was recognised in 2010 by winning Best Jazz Pianist in the British Jazz Awards. He regularly plays in Exeter at the Cygnet Theatre. Ben has played many times with his Dad's groups at Clubs and Jazz Festivals. Ben's astonishing technique and ability has been praised by such great guitarists as Nigel Price and Dominic Ashworth.

So we were given a fabulous evening of songs Paul had written, often recorded in the past and songs he plans to record in the future. This gig was really a sort of practice as they hadn't been playing together for long but it was clear that we were given an evening of music by three great musicians.

From The Rector

Cream Teas served in The Village Hall from 2.30-4.30pm

We'd love to see local residents and neighbours in the Village Hall on Saturday 27th June when we shall have our Annual Gift Day. Most of the cost of looking after our beautiful Church falls to those who worship in it Sunday by Sunday. We like to give the wider community a chance share in it's upkeep: this is your day to make a gift. Every village Church is an asset to the community, whether or not you're a "regular" and we hope you'll take the chance to hare in looking after it.

The building is expensive to maintain. This year the government withdrew its Listed Building VAT refund, effectively raising the cost of repair by 20% in one fell swoop. The promised grants to replace this subsidy have not yet been revealed and will be much harder to claim, especially by small churches like ours. There are no other government funds to support parish churches. It's always been the case that they are funded and repaired by the locals. This is even more the case now than it was before.

I'm hoping for a sunny afternoon, with pleasant company and happy conversation. Thank you, in advance. You're welcome to come for a cream tea, and a gift is your choice should you wish to make a contribution.

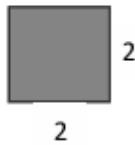
Retiring from Ministry

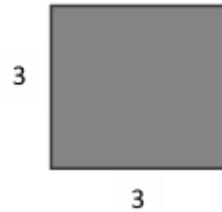

Square Numbers

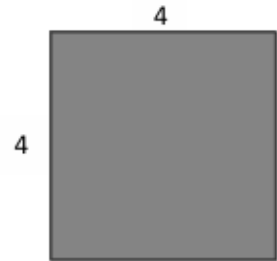
Draw a square and calculate its area:



$$2 \times 2 = 4$$



$$3 \times 3 = 9$$

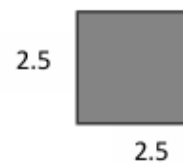


$$4 \times 4 = 16$$

The whole numbers, 1, 4, 9, 16... are called *square numbers* for obvious reasons. We write square numbers like this:

$25 = 5^2$ pronounced 5 squared. Absolutely never pronounced 5 times 2. (I have noticed people often confuse 5^2 and 5×2 .) Square numbers are never less than zero, they are never negative numbers.

This square has an area of 6.25
6.25 is not a square number
because it is not a whole number
even though you can write it as 2.5^2



Pythagoras was born in Greece in 570 BC. He knew about square numbers. There is a famous theorem named after him although he didn't actually invent it. We usually write Pythagoras' theorem as $a^2 + b^2 = c^2$. You may have come across this before where a, b, c are the three sides of a right angled triangle. When three whole numbers satisfy this theorem, the three numbers together are called Pythagorean Triples.

One Pythagorean Triple is 3, 4, 5 because $3^2 + 4^2 = 5^2$

Here are some other Pythagorean Triples:

7, 24, 25

8, 15, 17

9, 40, 41

11, 60, 61

You might like to get out your calculator or phone and check whether these triples really do satisfy Pythagoras' Theorem.

Here is a puzzle for you:

This year, 2026 can be written as the sum of two square numbers.

What are they? (Hint: $1^2 = 1$)
