### **St Andrew's School Choir**

#### **Benjamin Baker**

Benjamin Baker is an experienced church organist and formerly Senior Organ Scholar at Bishop Wordsworth's School, where he has just finished his final year of Sixth Form. In October, he is hoping to start reading History and German with an organ scholarship at Jesus College, Oxford. He regularly accompanies services at a number of church and school events and has played at a wide range of different venues and organs from here at St Andrew's to the magnificent Willis organ of Salisbury Cathedral.

#### **Greg Smith Jazz Ensemble**

5 piece band with Greg Smith on Cornet, Elizabeth Moulard on Horn, Russell Moulard on Trombone, Hamish Webb on Euphonium and Ben Kinsey Bass

#### **Chris Shuker**

Acoustic musical performance of popular guitar songs from 50s-60s and beyond. Chris Shuker's musical roots lie in the acoustic 'do-it-yourself' skiffle and country music of the 1950s and 60s. From there, it was on into the protest songs and folk-rock spearheaded by Bob Dylan and then the revolution of Buddy Holly, the Everly Brothers, Elvis and, of course, the Beatles. But, for Chris, one thing remains the same – acoustic musical performance.

#### **The Salisbury Pluckers**

2026 marks the 10th anniversary of this local ukulele band's first public performance. Over those 10 years, public and private audiences have been entertained in venues ranging from the Playhouse to care homes, thousands have been raised for local charities, and the members have found fun and companionship performing alongside one another.

#### **Maerefolk**

A four piece band of Salisbury people who love traditional folk music; songs and tunes as well as occasional contemporary original pieces. They are Andrew Fisher (fiddle), Fiona Hulbert (vocals), Hadrian Cook (bass) and Michael Camp (guitar and vocals). Expect some foot tapping energy as well as some gentle stories.

## **Sunday 28 June**

#### **Damian Clarke**

Damian Clarke plays the Hammer Dulcimer and Hurdy Gurdy, both of which he sings with. They are two intriguing instruments from ancient and medieval times. Damian sings a range of material from old to modern, traditional folk to pop. Most of his material would fall into the traditional folk genre; story songs and tunes from Ireland and the British Isles.
