Lord Almighty, send down upon this sacrifice your Holy Spirit. May he declare this bread that we shall eat to be the body of Christ, and this cup that we shall drink to be the blood of Christ. May he strengthen and sanctify us who eat this bread and drink this cup, grant forgiveness of our sins and deliver us from the wiles of the devil. May he fill us with his presence to make us worthy of Christ, your Son, and obtain for us eternal life. Amen.

*Please stand when the bell rings and join in the procession if you are able.*

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

*The priest introduces the Mass*

Brothers and sisters, to prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries let us call to mind our sins.

Homily – Fr Jarrett



*After a time of reflection please stand when the priest stands.*

**I believe in one God, the Father almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,

and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became  
man. *(all stand)***

**For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate,  
he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day  
in accordance with the Scriptures.**

**He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead  
and his kingdom will have no end.**

**I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,  
who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the  
Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.**

**I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.**

**I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins  
and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead  
and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

*After a brief silence the Priest concludes the prayers. Please then be seated for the Offertory, during which a collection will be taken for God's work here - thank you. The bread, wine, altar, cross, priest and people are censed. Please stand when the thurifer approaches.*

Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, for ever and ever.

**Amen.**

*Please stand*

At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

**Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.**

**Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses,**

**as we forgive those who trespass against us;**

**and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.**

Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

Grant, O Lord, we pray, that we may delight for all eternity in that share in your divine life, which is foreshadowed in the present age by our reception of your precious Body and Blood. Who live and reign for ever and ever.  
**Amen.**

*Please kneel as the Blessed Sacrament is placed on the altar*

*When the Blessed Sacrament has passed you, please stand and follow the procession. On returning to your place please kneel.*

*Then in a moment of quiet we make our thanksgivings to God.*

**Toccata on All for Jesus** in the style of a French Sortie, or leaving voluntary, uses the phrases of the tune at high speed in the manner of a Carillon, with quotations line by line in the bass. The third quarter is in the minor mode before a return to the tonic of D major. After a very long Mass and Procession, a short voluntary is called for.
