The Word of God

Psalm 100

¹O be joyful in the Lord, all the earth; ♦
serve the Lord with gladness
and come before his presence with a song.

²Know that the Lord is God; ♦
it is he that has made us and we are his;
we are his people and the sheep of his pasture.

³Enter his gates with thanksgiving
and his courts with praise; ♦
give thanks to him and bless his name.

⁴For the Lord is gracious; his steadfast love is everlasting, ♦

First Reading: Romans 5:1-8

¹Since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ²through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. ³And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

⁶For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly.

⁷Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person – though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. ⁸But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.

Canticle

**Splendour and majesty are yours, O God;

³⁵Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. ³⁶When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷Then he said to his disciples, ‘The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; ³⁸therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.’

¹Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness.

²These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; ³Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax-collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; ⁴Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

⁵These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: ‘Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, ⁶but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. ⁷As you go, proclaim the good news, “The kingdom of heaven has come near.” ⁸Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment.

unwilling to share them with others;
commission us, inspire us, open us out.
Help us to tell others of your promises.

When we need the assurance of your promises, loving God,
and live our lives in darkness and despair,
overwhelmed by pain, sorrow or guilt,
needing to know your presence with us;
reassure us, comfort us, strengthen us.
Help us to experience the power of your promises.

Loving God, you have promised that you will be with us always and
everywhere.

You have promised us that we can be one with you in Jesus,
if we but trust in you.

You have promised us new and abundant life.

Help us to rely on these promises, to live by them, and to share
them with others.

In the name of Christ, your Word to us, **Amen.**
