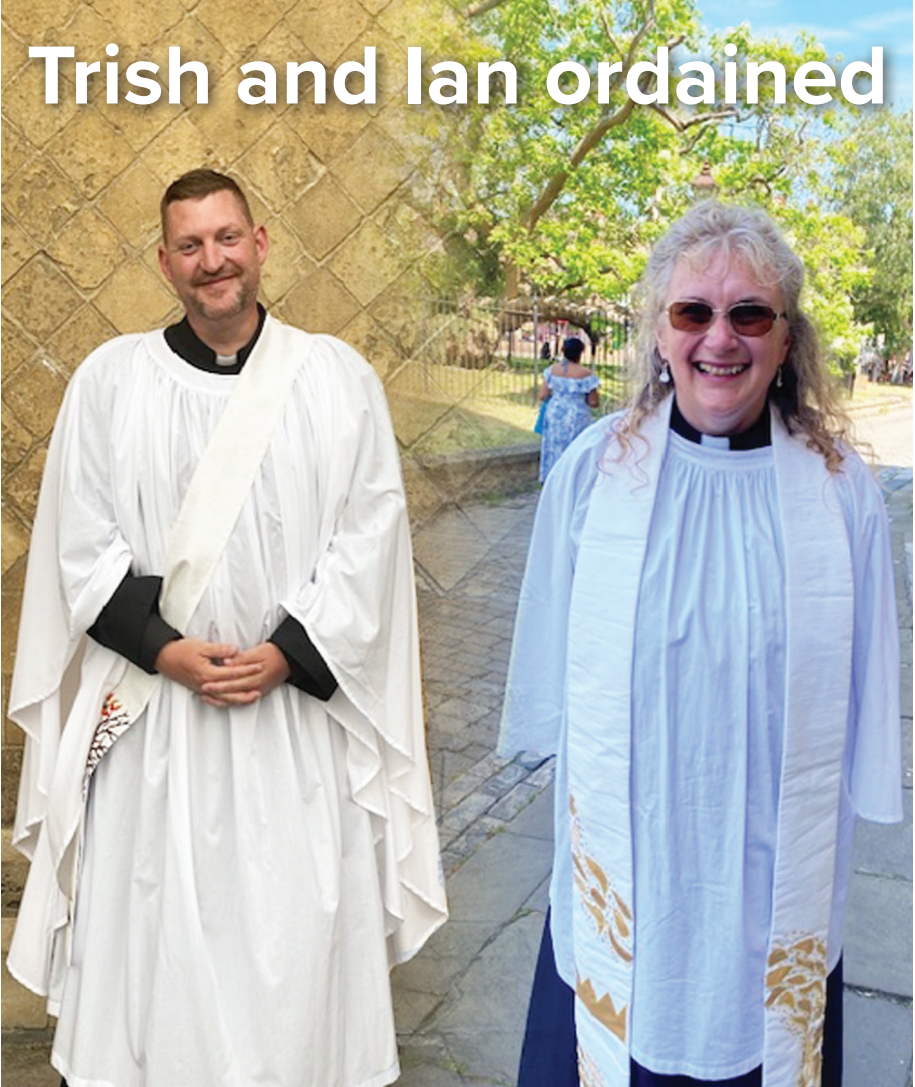

Choral Scholarship Programme Donor Appeal 2026

The Choral Scholarship Programme at St Mary's has been running successfully since 2021. It enables young people from the local community aged 7-18 to experience the church's wonderful choral tradition and to develop their own musical skills and enjoyment of choral music. The congregation at St Mary's also benefits greatly, as church services at least twice a month are enhanced by their singing. There are currently between 10 and 20 "Treblemakers" making up the junior choir and 8 Choral Scholars (Junior and Senior), in addition to the adult Core Choir (new members always welcome!) We are also seeking an Organ Scholar.

The programme has been funded each year from three sources:

- 1) Generous donations from the congregation of St Mary's
- 2) Initial grants from external bodies (such as the Royal School of Church Music, which gave St Mary's the inaugural Church Choir Award in 2023) and a generous annual grant from the Malling Memorial Institute
- 3) Fundraising by the choir itself, such as the Showcase Concerts

Although recently streamlined and reorganised, the scheme still costs in the region of £6000 per year.

Kings Hill Rotary had a busy June, supporting community activities run by other organisations while also hosting its annual **Community Afternoon Tea** at the Holiday Inn and launching a new project, Books4Home.

The popular Community Afternoon Tea took place on 7th June and welcomed more than 40 guests, accompanied by family members, friends and carers.

This year's theme was **"100 years of Winnie the Pooh"**. Gifts, a quiz, music and flowers all reflected the theme. Gladys, a regular guest, joined the event again at the age of 109, and the Club looks forward to welcoming her back in 2027. Beautiful flower arrangements, created by Club member Wendy, were also given away in a free draw at each table.



The afternoon tea was funded through the Club's fundraising activities, including the Santa Sleigh around Kings Hill at Christmas. A good time was had by all, and the Club has received many warm messages of thanks. It hopes to hold the event again next year. Thanks also go to the hotel staff for their friendly service, which helped make the afternoon such a success.





Next came Books4Home, a Rotary in Great Britain and Ireland-wide venture.

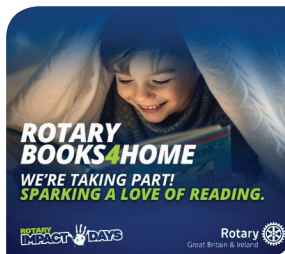
With children's enjoyment of reading reportedly at its lowest level since records began, **Rotary Books4Home** gives members an exciting opportunity to support schools, encourage a love of reading and make a lasting impact on literacy skills. Kings Hill Rotary has collected donations of 780 books and given 200 to the Discovery School and a further 200 to Kings Hill Primary School for pupils to take home and keep. The project also supports the environment because the books are good-quality, second-hand copies, rather than new ones. Books not suited to the age groups at these schools have been donated to other charities, including #makeadifferencetomaidstone and the BooksforZimbabwe project. This helps avoid books being sent to landfill and saves the equivalent



CO2 emissions of a 17-mile car journey, compared with producing one new book.

Sally McCarville, Assistant Headteacher at Kings Hill School said "these books may provide opportunities they would not otherwise have at home. We know that reading opens doors, sparks imagination and has the power to change lives and would like to thank Kings Hill Rotary for their continued support of our school and wider community"

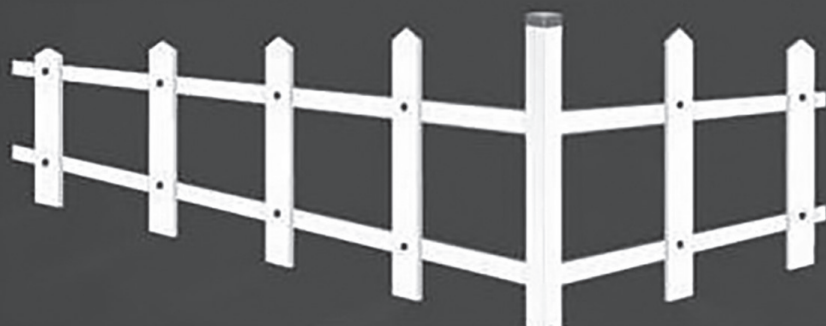
