News from the Parishes

Admission of Churchwardens 2026

8 of our WVG Benefice Churchwardens along with their supporters - parishioners from their church and family, joined 300 other churchwardens from the diocesan Ely Cathedral on Sunday 14th June for a service of Choral Evensong and Admission. It was a moving service, the music was wonderful and sermon by the Archdeacon of Cambridge was particularly fitting and inspiring. The service can be watched on Ely Diocese YouTube channel

The remaining 3 churchwardens were admitted by Archdeacon Richard Harlow at the joint Benefice PCC meeting in All Saints Church, Whittington on Monday 15th June.

Both events marked the beginning of our Churchwarden's tenure for the coming year, affirming their commitment to serve, and receiving encouragement for the year ahead.

Churchwardens have a unique and valued ministry within the life of the Church. As the Bishop's officers in the parish, they work closely with the clergy and PCC to support worship, mission, pastoral care, and the day-to-day life of the church.

They also share responsibility for the care of our church buildings and for ensuring that our churches remain welcoming places of prayer and community.

We are deeply grateful to those who have accepted this responsibility on behalf of our parishes.

Their willingness to serve is a gift to us all, and we thank them for the time, energy, and commitment they give so generously. Please keep our Churchwardens in your prayers as they undertake this important ministry.



Being a Baptism Co-ordinator

With Tammy Wright and Susan Parker-Smith



Tammy Wright

What are the biggest challenges you face when coordinating baptismal services?

Tammy:

Last minute baptisms are not a favourite - I often have families that would like one in a few weeks and this is virtually impossible when liaising with Church wardens and Vicars.

Susan:

The biggest challenge I face, once I've been given the families contact details, is getting them to reply to me to set a date to meet them.

Can adults be baptised?

Tammy and Susan:

Definitely - you are never too old! The preparation is a little different but all are welcome.

If people are not regular attendees to church - would the church still baptise them?

Tammy and Susan:

We are happy to baptise anyone who wants to start their faith journey and be welcomed into the Christian family.

How do you prepare parents and godparents for a baptism?

Tammy:

I start with email or telephone conversations; I then organise a face-to-face meeting. Sometimes extra meetings are arranged if wanted.

Susan:

I meet them, chat about family, ask why they want a baptism, gently correcting false assumptions like 'so they can get married in church', we read through the service sheet and I point out how important the responses are and I answer any questions.

Does a godparent have to be baptized to be a godparent?

Tammy:

Godparents are required to be baptized (christened) and ideally confirmed. However, if someone is not baptized, they can often still be involved as "supporting friends" or "sponsors" in the service. The Vicar will offer advice on this.

Susan:

Yes, but I offer to have them baptised first or, provided 2 are, say the others can be 'sponsors' but no one at the service will see them treated differently.

How do you support families who have little previous experience with the church?

Tammy:

Informal meetings are a great way to support and introduce the church to people. Meeting at the church is amazing, to show them around and when not in a service it is less daunting. It is often after the baptism that more questions are asked and a gentle support is given to come back again.

Susan:

I encourage folks to meet me, and hopefully the churchwarden and clergy if available, in church to look around, see the font and where they will sit etc. It's especially important if it's a young child rather than a baby being baptised as the font can look scary if you can't see inside!

Given the unpredictability of babies and children, what has been the funniest moment you have encountered?

Tammy:

I have heard of a dummy falling into the holy water and for one anxious child their toy dinosaur was baptised first to show them there was nothing to be worried about.

Susan:

The vicar baptising his granddaughter and letting her splash her feet in the font. The youngster who burst into tears and hid when the water was poured into the font...her mum casually said 'Oh, she's terrified of water!'

What moments in baptisms or children's ministry have been especially meaningful to you?

Tammy:

When I see a family grow and they ask to have their new babies baptised .

When I meet families in the community who ask me about baptism or my faith and then later they choose to start their or their families journey into faith - this doesn't have to be a baptism but seeing them in church is lovely.

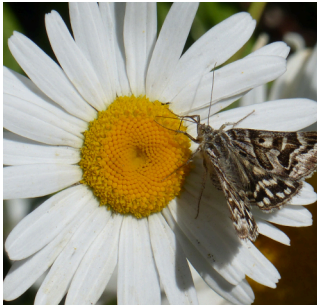
Susan:

When a family organising baby baptism, having had our meeting, asked to have adults baptised too and hearing that they joined their local church

Beachamwell Open Gardens

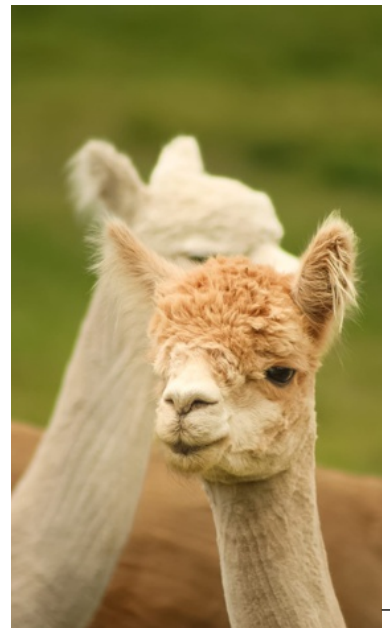
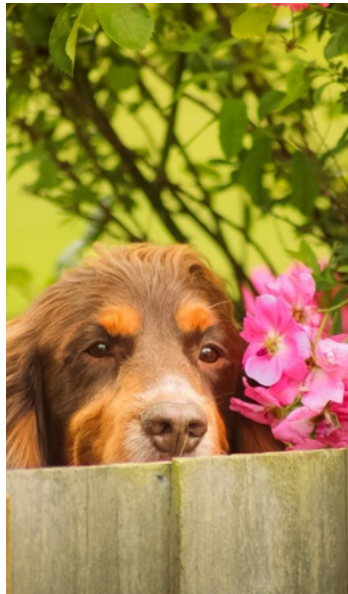
Boughton Open Gardens

gentle breeze was most welcome.**

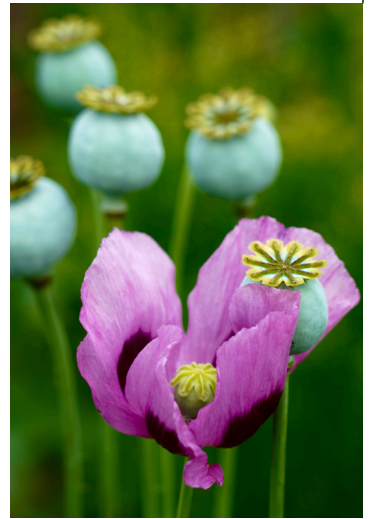

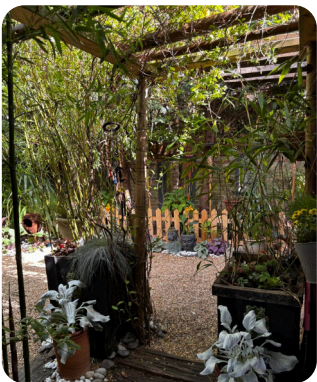
This year 15 gardens were open, and we were joined for the first time by The Old Workshop, where various beauty treatments are on offer and where the management are very keen to be part of a very close community.

New Bishop of Ely

Right Reverend Sarah Elizabeth Clark was installed as the 70th Bishop of Ely during a special service held at Ely Cathedral on 21st June.

Friends, family, clergy, lay leaders, education and business leaders and colleagues from civic society across the Diocese and beyond joined Bishop Sarah for the celebration.



Bishop Sarah swore oaths with her hand on an ancient copy of the Gospels from the late sixth century.



Bishop Sarah strikes the door three times with her Pastoral Staf as a powerful symbol of humility, servitude, and pilgrimage. By asking for entry, the new leader demonstrates that they are entering not as a harsh master, but as a humble servant and shepherd of the flock



The bishop was questioned by youth from the diocese, to declare their identity and why they have come.

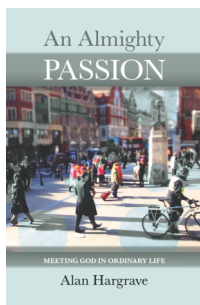

An Almighty Passion - by Alan Hargrave
Recommended by Janet Tanton

Alan Hargrave has led an interesting life: an agricultural missionary in South America, vicar of a church in a deprived area of Cambridge and later serving as Canon Missioner at Ely Cathedral. The book contains stories from his life and ministry. Some are joyful, others will move you to tears. All of them remind us that God is always with us.

The Burning Chambers by Kate Mosse

Set in Carcassonne in 1562 on the eve of the wars that will tear France apart, this book reveals a chance encounter between Minou Joubert, a young Catholic girl and Piet Reydon, a Huguenot, who profoundly reshapes her destiny. A gripping story of religion, love, betrayal, war and conspiracy.
