Homily – Fr Edmonds SSC, Associate Archdeacon of Doncaster

After a time of reflection, please stand when the priest stands

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,

who proceeds from the Father and the Son,

who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified,

who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.

I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins

and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Organ Voluntary

Given the state of the organ in response to hot, dry weather, I am not taking the risk of listing an elaborate voluntary which requires most things to be working. Also, with a long start to the Mass, a short voluntary might not be unwelcome. So, here is a delightful little **Fugue on one of the Magnificat** plainsong tones, by **Johann Pachelbel**. Obviously, the Magnificat originates at the other end of Mary's life, on meeting Elizabeth when both awaited the birth of their children. It has been adopted ecumenically and worldwide as a joyful history of salvation, and as such is not remotely unsuitable for today.

You may like to recite this 4th Century prayer of thanksgiving. Father, we thank you for your holy name which you have made to dwell in our hearts and for the knowledge, faith and immortality which you have made known to us through your servant Jesus. To you be glory for ever. Amen
