The Bible reading is from Isaiah chapter 51 verses 1 to 6

Listen to me, you that pursue
righteousness, you that seek the Lord.
Look to the rock from which you were
hewn, and to the quarry from which you
were dug. Look to Abraham your father
and to Sarah who bore you; for he was
but one when I called him, but I blessed
him and made him many. For the Lord
will comfort Zion; he will comfort all her
waste places, and will make her
wilderness like Eden, her desert like the
garden of the Lord; joy and gladness
will be found in her, thanksgiving and
the voice of song.

Listen to me, my people, and give heed
to me, my nation; for a teaching will go
out from me, and my justice for a light
to the peoples. I will bring near my
deliverance swiftly, my salvation has
gone out and my arms will rule the
peoples; the coastlands wait for
me, and for my arm they hope. Lift up

Peter's Declaration about Jesus

Now when Jesus came into the district
of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his

He said to them, 'But who do you say
that I am?' Simon Peter answered, 'You
