with all my heart, all my mind, with all my soul, and with all my strength.
I would that henceforth neither tribulation nor distress, nor
persecution, nor life, nor death, nor any created thing should separate
me from thee. Quench then by thy Holy Spirit all love of the world and
myself, enable me to bear thy sweet yoke, that I may learn of thee to
be meek and lowly of heart. Make me to realize my own nothingness,
that I may learn to esteem others better than myself. O meek and

**The Examen: A Daily Prayer
by S. Ignatius of Loyola SJ**
(c. 23 October 1491– 31 July 1556)

S. Ignatius Loyola's Examen is an opportunity for peaceful daily reflective prayer. It invites us to find the movement of God in all the people and events of our day. The Examen is simply a set of introspective prompts for you to follow or adapt to your own character and spirit.

Begin with a pause and a slow, deep breath or two;
Place yourself in God's presence.
Give thanks for God's great love for you.

Thanksgiving

What am I especially grateful for in the past day . . .
The gift of another day...
The love and support I have received...
The courage I have mustered...
An event that took place today...

Petition

I am about to review my day; I ask for the light to know God
and to know myself as God sees me.

Review

Where have I felt true joy today?
What has troubled me today?
What has challenged me today?
Where and when did I pause today?
Have I noticed God's presence in any of this?
Reflect on what you did, said, or thought in those instances.
Were you drawing closer to God, or further away?

Response

In light of my review, what is my response to the God of my life?

A Look Ahead

As I look ahead, what comes to mind?
With what spirit do I want to enter tomorrow?
Think of how you might collaborate more effectively with the
Reign of God. Be specific, and conclude with the "Our Father."
