Bring and share

Have you been to a social where you're asked to bring something? The host might provide the 'main', and you might be asked to bring a 'side' (note how these Americanisms are creeping in) or a dessert. This is nearly always a recipe for over-catering. There may be no main on offer, and this is a sure-fire way to ensure that the table overflows, and we go away with other people's *Tupperware* (other airtight see-through lidded boxes are available) or tin foil.



Jesus just invites us to come as we are, because Jesus does not ask us to provide what we do not possess. He asks us to surrender what we *do* have, no matter how small or inadequate it feels. Whether it is our time, our modest financial resource, or a fragile gramme of patience, our small offerings become infinite in His hands.

This is why the invitation to the Eucharist is irresistible, if we wish to be fed with what we cannot possibly provide on our own. What ought we to bring or to give Him? It's not Christmas, yet, the last verse of *In the bleak mid-winter* holds at all times.

*What can I give Him?
Give my heart.*

Welcome to the Eucharist, also known as
Holy Communion or The Mass

This act of worship is a partnership between the priest and the people who:

- greet each other in the Lord's name
- confess their sins and, if repentant, are assured of God's forgiveness
- keep silence and pray a Collect
(a special prayer or collection of thoughts for that day)
- proclaim and respond to the word of God in scripture and reflect on it
- pray for the Church, the world and those in need
- exchange the Peace (this should be a simple gesture, not a major interruption to the flow of the service)
- prepare the table (it is only a table, but it becomes an altar)
- pray the Eucharistic Prayer (listen along and pray, and over time these words will become more familiar to you.
- break the bread (which recalls Christ's body, broken on the Cross)
- receive communion (or a blessing instead)
- depart with God's blessing, to go in peace to love and serve the Lord

If you have arrived very late, relax! Sit still and make your confession knowing God understands and loves you. Then read the Gospel, and join us in full when you are ready.
