### The Southern Comfort

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#### A Piece of Horning's Living History



If you've strolled along the riverbank in Horning, you'll have seen her — the unmistakable silhouette of the Southern Comfort, our very own replica Mississippi paddle steamer, chugging gently along the Bure. But how many of us know the curious story of how she came to call our village home?

#### **Born in the 1970s — for a rather crafty reason**

The Southern Comfort was built in the 1970s for the then owner of the Hotel Wroxham, Tony Sands. Her original purpose had nothing to do with river cruising at all.

In those days, licensing laws forced pubs and hotel bars to shut their doors during the afternoon — but the law had a loophole. It didn't apply to vessels on the Broads, which fell instead under maritime law. So the hotel moored the newly built paddle steamer alongside its riverbank, giving thirsty patrons somewhere to carry on their afternoon when the hotel bar itself was forced to close.

#### **The move to Horning**

Once licensing laws relaxed and pubs were permitted to stay open all day, the Southern Comfort's original job became redundant. In 1979 she was sold and made the short journey downriver to Horning, where she began a new life as a passenger vessel — and where she has remained proudly ever since.

#### **A crew member, Anne Gilden, remembers**



Few people know the boat's history better than Anne Gilden, who retired at the end of 2024 after decades as one of the Southern Comfort's longest-serving crew.

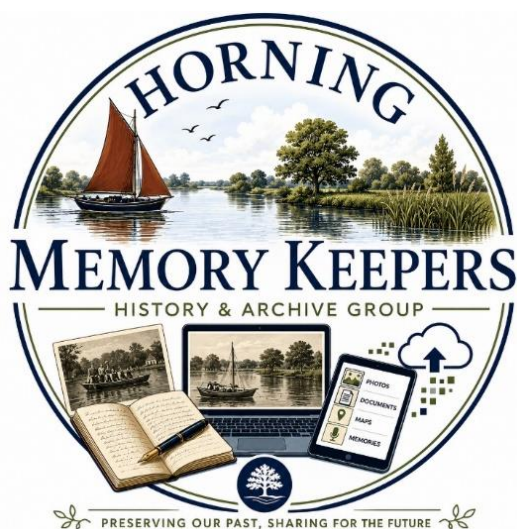
When Anne worked at the Swan (where she met her life partner and husband-to-be, Alan) she was just 20 years old when the Southern Comfort first arrived in Horning. The boat needed crew, so on her day off Anne stepped aboard to help out with that very first sailing — and simply never left.



Anne has many memories and met some famous people during her time on The Southern Comfort including Val Doonican and Jimmy Tarbuck, when casts from the Great Yarmouth shows chartered the boat for late night cruises but her most favourite memory was spending the afternoon with the singer David Essex (oh... and the time a man was pushed off the boat by his irate wife!).

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## *Horning Memory Keepers*

What happens to memories once the people who hold them are gone?

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That question has been driving a small team of us since the Memories of Old Horning Day, when so many of you signed up wanting to be kept up to date on progress towards setting up a history and archive group. Here's where things stand.

We (now called Horning Memory Keepers) have been working quietly behind the scenes to explore what's really involved in setting up a group like this – and, just as importantly, what it takes to keep it going for the long haul.

We've been in touch with others who've walked this path before us: the Neatishead, Irstead, Barton Turf Community Heritage Group (NIBCHG) and the Ludham archive group. Every group does things a little differently, and there's no single 'right' way to do this. What has become clear is that recording and preserving memories properly is a genuine challenge, calling for IT skills, dedication, time and money – often more of each than you'd expect.

### **Where We're Up To**

None of that has put us off, though it may look from the outside like things have gone quiet. In truth, the team has been meeting regularly, squeezed in around everyone's other commitments. So far we have:

- Drafted a constitution and a finance plan – both essential steps towards opening a bank account
- Applied for funding to help cover costs such as equipment and hall hire
- Been exploring options for a space to work from and to store equipment securely
- Been writing regular updates such as this for the Horning Reach to keep the wider village informed
- Started looking for IT support – for recording and sharing memories, and for setting up a dedicated email address and website

### **How You Can Help**

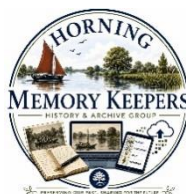

Uncover a thousand years of history on the Broads

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Have you ever wondered about the history and stories of St Benet's Abbey?

The guiding season continues at 2pm on Saturdays and Wednesdays until the end of September, and our knowledgeable guides will be delighted to show you around the site and tell you the stories from more than a thousand years of history. You'd be surprised how St Benet's Abbey is linked to important moments in the history of England, such as the Norman Conquest, the Peasants' Revolt, Henry VIII and WW2 spies.



Tours last approximately 60 minutes. There is a small charge of £5 per adult, which helps NAT to care for the site and enhance the visitor experience. Accompanied under-18s go free, and parking is free.

### Medieval Women in Norwich — a talk by Sally-Anne Lomas

Neatishead, Irstead & Barton Turf Community Heritage Group are looking forward to September's presentation on the life of Medieval Women in Norwich, given by Sally-Anne Lomas, a well-known local writer and documentary film maker who has a particular interest in the English Christian Mystic, Julian of Norwich.

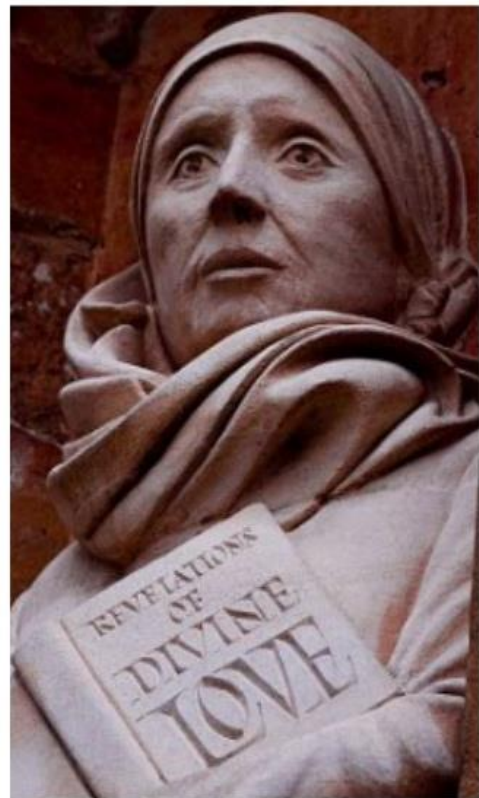
### Medieval Women of Norwich

#### Julian of Norwich (1342 – c.1416)

Julian of Norwich was an English mystic who spent much of her life enclosed as an anchoress in a small cell attached to St Julian's Church in Norwich.

In 1373, aged about thirty, she experienced sixteen visions during a severe illness, later writing them down as *Revelations of Divine Love* — believed to be the earliest surviving book in English written by a woman.

She is best remembered for the words 'All shall be well, and all shall be well, and all manner of thing shall be well', a message of hope that still resonates today.

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## Gardening Diary – September

Time to plant bulbs, divide perennials and gather the last of the harvest.

---

Hopefully... September will arrive on a cooler breeze, the light softening to amber as summer's exuberance gives way to autumn's quiet abundance. Dew clings to spider webs at dawn, apples ripen heavy on the bough, and borders blaze with the last great flourish of asters, sedums and dahlias before the season turns.

### Time to Tidy and Transition

September is a month of transition, bridging summer's abundance and autumn's structure. Perennials that have finished flowering can be cut back, lifted and divided, while spent summer bedding makes way for winter and spring displays. Spring bulbs can go in now for a colourful show next year, and the vegetable patch still has plenty to offer, from ripening squash to late sowings of hardy salad leaves. It's a productive, satisfying time in the garden.

Dahlias will continue flowering until the first frost.



### Things to do:

1. Cut back and divide overgrown perennials.
2. Plant spring bulbs — save tulips until November.
3. Harvest apples, pears, plums and ripe pumpkins.
4. Sow hardy salad leaves, spinach and winter lettuce.
5. Plant onion sets and cabbages; net against birds.
6. Swap tired summer bedding for violas and wallflowers.
7. Mow less often and raise the cutting height.
8. Collect and save seeds before autumn winds scatter them.  
*Dry seeds should be stored in a paper bag/envelope, labelled with name and date*
9. Give the greenhouse a thorough end-of-season clean.
10. Leave seedheads and windfalls for garden wildlife.

As summer fades gently into autumn, every task now sets the stage for next year's blooms.

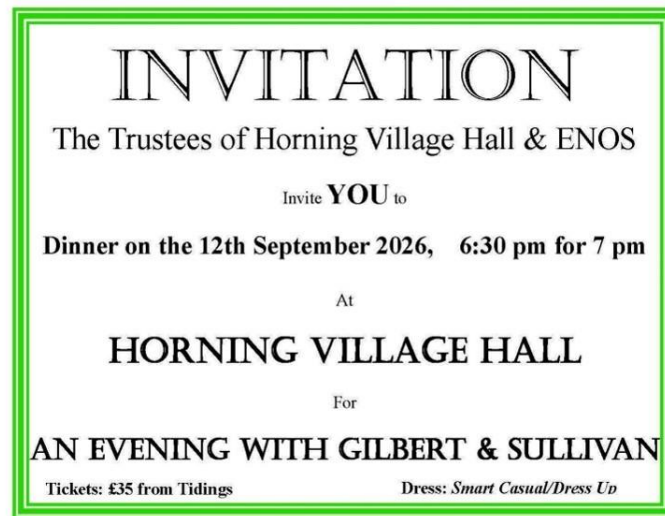

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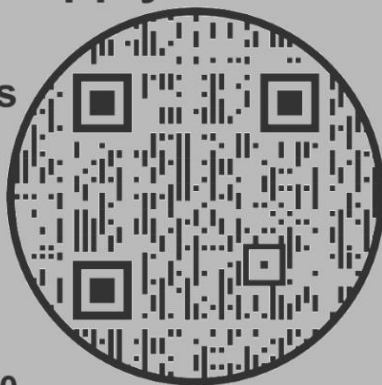


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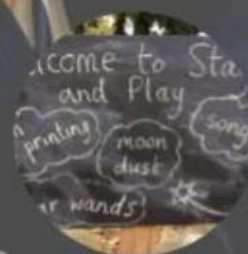
