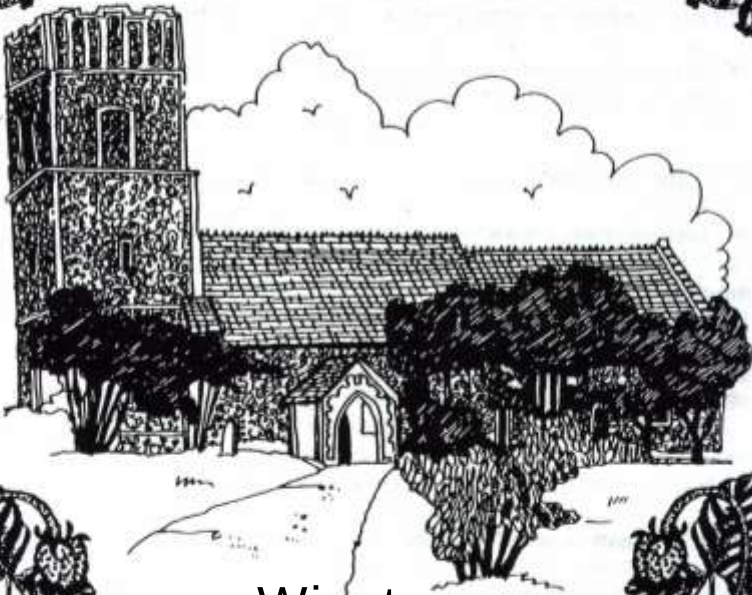

Reflection by Rev'd Keith Rengert

Writing this autumn article on the last day of the school term before the long summer holiday is giving me a certain sense of déjà vu.

I remember as a school child being unimpressed by the shops in town all displaying their 'Back to School' signs. In the first week off the school holidays I did not want to be reminded that I would have to go 'Back to School'.

When you work in a school and are subject to this world of academic terms, the years really do seem to speed by. It is the same when working for the church. By the time you read this we will already be immersed in our Harvest Festival services both in churches and our schools. From there it always seems a downhill rush to the end of the year and Christmas. Rev'd Susan and I have already begun to get dates in the diary for the Christingle Service 2026.

Of course there is nothing wrong with forward planning, in fact for many of us it is a very necessary part of life. I remember at my wife's childhood church they always used to add the postscript to their weekly notices with the phrase, 'All these events will of course be if the Lord will'. I remember thinking that this was a bit of an obvious statement and as such unnecessary albeit quite true. It is though perhaps a reminder that although there are many good reasons to attempt to plan the future, there is a big difference between that and trying to control the future. We cannot do this, the closest we ever get to doing so is perhaps an illusion.

Part of a meditation by Anne Morrow Lindbergh from Celtic Daily Prayer says this; *'Live from day to day, just from day to day. If you do so, you worry less and live life more richly. If you let yourself be absorbed completely, if you surrender completely to the moments as they pass, you live more richly those moments'.*

Perhaps this sounds unrealistic, but it only echoes what Jesus himself said about not worrying about tomorrow. He goes on to very realistically add, 'For tomorrow will have enough worries of its own'.

There's a lot to be commended in at least trying to slow down and live in the moment more. Let's live out the rest of 2026 and not be in such a rush to get to 2027 just yet.

Church Growth and Family Communion

This summer has been hot and dry in an unprecedented way. The fields around Debenham are parched and dusty. We need water for our gardens and crops to grow, in order for our livestock to be fed and ultimately for us, the human beings, to flourish.

The dryness of our countryside led me to reflect on our church community in Debenham and in our wider benefice (collection of 7 parishes with one vicar). This Summer we have been thinking a lot about how we long for our church to grow. As Christians we believe we are called to follow Jesus' teaching: a) striving to be loving to all people, to be kind and caring, forgiving and helping others; b) believing that there is a life beyond this life that awaits us all, and; c), most importantly, that our lives are lived in and for a love that we cannot begin to comprehend or describe... and that love we call

‘God’. These beliefs have given our lives a meaning and purpose; a depth of peace and joy that we did not have before we were Christians... and we want to share all that good stuff with others. So, we want our church to grow. We want to encourage others to come along and join us: to be part of, to belong to, a loving community. In order for us to grow we must not be dry and dusty! Our church and our faith must be bubbling up with fresh, life-giving ideas; with love, life and laughter! And, invitation and welcome.

Hence this Summer we have been thinking about growth. We have been to a conference called ‘Leading your Church into Growth’ and have had a couple of benefice meetings where we have started to discern what God wants us to do, so others will join us in getting to know God and Jesus. We are already a vibrant church in Debenham, we have lots of parish engagement with the Parish Pantry and Café and involvement in all sorts of community events, like supporting Rivers Day run by the Green Team. We are very supportive of our local schools. Rev Susan is a Governor at both schools and The Church of England finances Rev Keith’s role as School Chaplain at Debenham High School. We have lots of ‘secular’ events in the church, such as the jumble sale and music evenings. And we have a whole range of services to welcome everyone, from families and children, to the ‘not-so-young’!

A big part of our discerning how we might grow is to ask God to help us, and I have included the prayer we are using, in case you would like to offer that prayer too. From our recent prayers and meetings, we have now started a different service on the third Sunday of the month. We have called it ‘Family Communion’. This is a more informal and relaxed service. It is a bit shorter than our services on 2nd and 4th Sundays and has a similar feel to our very popular family@church on the first Sunday of the month. Instead of breakfast at family@church, everyone is invited to join us in receiving the bread and (non-alcoholic) wine in remembrance of Jesus’ last supper with his disciples. It is a fun, inclusive service and everyone is invited and welcome. So please do come and join us at any of our services, we would love to see you and to share God’s love and joy.
